



BIRDING HOTSPOTS

BIRDING

Central Park

Manhattan's island of green is the place to see songbirds in spring, hawks in fall, owls and woodpeckers in winter, and the most famous Red-tailed Hawk in the world

It was a moody morning in mid-May. As the thickets undimmed in the waxing pre-dawn light and our small group gathered, a special feeling filled the air. I was leading a birdathon (a birding fundraiser). For it to be a success, I had to do more than identify birds; I had to hear and find them and decide which birds the group could observe (or identify). I also wanted to find "gee-whiz" birds and a stellar variety of species.

My goals appeared to be within reach even before we took a step. I could hear plenty of calls in the warm, still air near the trailhead, indicating a good migration during the night before.

We entered the woods on a paved path and began seeing birds right away—lots of them. The ground was nearly covered with thrushes. We'd hit the jackpot, the season's thrush fall-out. Of course, plenty of warblers, sparrows, vireos, tanagers, and orioles were round, but the thrushes left me saying, "Wow!"


At other times, I've hit a warbler day or a bid day for migrants in general. I remember one mid-May morning when I found 98 species, including Yellow- and Black-billed Cuckoo, three species of nightjars, and a staggering 28 species of wood warblers—and I was still finding great birds when I had to leave to get to work by 9 a.m. This day looked to be even better.

And then the real magic began: The birds started singing. First a Wood Thrush tuned up, then a Veery or two. I heard a late Hermit and a Swainson's. Hey, wait, wasn't that a Gray-checked Thrush?

And hard to believe, next was a Bicknell's Thrush. All of the eastern North American thrushes were singing within earshot.

Where was this special wilderness? We were in the Ramble, the wooded heart of Central Park, one of the premier birding locations in the United States.



DIRECTIONS:

The Butterfly Place is approximately 40 miles north of Boston and 5 miles from the Pheasant Lane Mall, Nashua, NH

From Route 3: Exit 34. Take Westford Road towards the town of Westford, bearing left onto Swan Road which very shortly becomes Tyngsboro Road. The Park is on the right (approx. 1 miles from Exit 34).

From Route 495: Exit 32. Go north on Boston Road to the center of Westford. At the common, go right onto Lincoln Street to Main Street. Take Depot Street off Main Street and follow to Route 40. Cross over Route 40. Depot changes to Tyngsboro Road. The Park is on the left (approx. 2 miles from Rt. 40).

The Butterfly Place is composed of a 3,100 square foot glass atrium building with 12 foot side walls tapering over laminated beams to a height of over 27 feet at the peak. Within the atrium is a living butterfly environment planted primarily with colorful flowering plants and shrubs to provide nectar for the butterflies.

At any given time, the atrium contains up to 500 butterflies representing as many as 40 different species.

We primarily feature butterflies of North America, but we do have some “special guests” from other places.

The types of butterflies we have on display changes quite a bit over the season so multiple visits can be very rewarding.

You may walk within the atrium on a winding walkway or observe it through observation windows. Be sure to visit or special display cases.



Purchase a Membership. Good for 20 admissions and discount coupons for our Butterfly Hatching Kits. Cost: \$130.00 (\$6.50/ticket). \$25.00 will be used to rebuild and for maintenance for every Membership sold.



Within the observation area are a number of display cases containing butterflies and moths at various stages of development. Each is labeled with information about the occupant(s) of the case.


The outside grounds are constantly being upgraded to attract local butterflies. Breeding and rearing areas can be observed along our outside pathways.


Additionally, we sell our unique “Papillon Butterfly Box”, a hatching kit containing chrysalids, cocoons or caterpillars of a number of local species.






It was on a dreary night of November that I beheld the accomplishment of my toils. With an anxiety that almost amounted to agony, I collected the instruments of life around me, that I might infuse a spark of being into the lifeless thing that lay at my feet. It was already one in the morning; the rain pattered dismally against the panes, and my candle was nearly burnt out, when, by the glimmer of the half-extinguished light, I saw the dull yellow eye of the creature open; it breathed hard, and a convulsive motion agitated its limbs.

In 1816, Mary and Percy Shelley travelled to Geneva. "It proved a wet, ungenial summer", she later recalled, "and incessant rain often confined us for days to the house." The conversation turned to the experiments of the 18th-century natural philosopher Erasmus Darwin, who was said to have animated dead matter. Sitting around a log fire at Byron's villa, the company amused themselves by reading German ghost stories, prompting Byron to suggest they each write their own supernatural tale. Shortly afterwards, in a waking dream, Mary conceived the idea for Frankenstein:


I saw the pale student of unhallowed arts kneeling beside the thing he had put together. I saw the hideous phantasm of a man stretched out, and then, on the working of some powerful engine, show signs of life, and stir with an uneasy, half vital motion.

She began writing what she assumed would be a short story, but which eventually became her first novel, Frankenstein: or, The Modern Prometheus, published in 1818. She later described that summer in Switzerland as the moment "when I first stepped out from childhood into life".




